Paradigm Research method Research design Concept of gender used Interpretive Qualitative interviews (one to one Hermeneutic depth interviews), participant observation (including informal interviews), open observations. WomenOs interpretations are sought. Studies tend to be in-depth, small scale and somewhat long duration. Possible learning transferrable to share vital aspects with the focus area.
